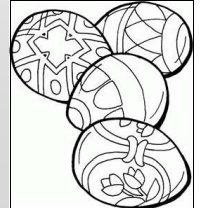

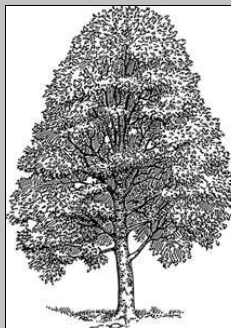

FROM THE MAYOR'S DESK...

BUDGET 2012

The 2012 Municipal Budget was introduced by the Borough Council on February 27, 2012. Based on the proposed budget, the new tax rate will be .445 cents /\$100 of assessed valuation. This represents an increase of \$108.80/year for a dwelling assessed at \$640,000. The average assessed value in the Borough has dropped from \$645,000 to \$640,000.

This issue of the HP Newsletter provides you with a summary of the appropriations for 2012. Please keep in mind that this does not include expenditures planned for our local school, regional high school and the county.

WHILE THE BOROUGH SERVES AS A COLLECTION ORGANIZATION FOR ALL THE PROPERTY TAXES, IT HAS NO CONTROL OVER THE CONY AND SCHOOL BUDGETS. AT THE PRESENT, THE COUNTY AND SCHOOL TAX LEVIES HAVE NOT BEEN FINALIZED AND THEREFORE , WE CANNOT PREDICT THE OVERALL TAX RATE.

Our intensive budget review and preparation process resulted in a 1.7 point increase in taxes. This is below the 2% cap rate mandated by the State. In Harrington Park, each tax point represents \$16,000. This translates into an increase of \$113,457. Given the fact that \$106,000 (rounded) of this amount is generated from expenses that are not controlled by the 2% cap, the budget is extremely lean.

We were hoping to provide you with better news regarding your municipal property taxes. However, due to recent tax appeals, the Borough lost \$16,000,000 in ratables. In addition, State aid from Trenton was decreased by \$361,184 this year. Our full time office staff remains at three. Our police force is still lower in numbers than it was years ago, and our DPW is staffed with only seven people. The use of SHARED SERVICE agreements and part time employees continue to provide us with needed services at reduced costs.

DESTRUCTION AT BEECHWOOD PARK

As many of you know, the Borough of Harrington Park owns and leases approximately 20 acres of vacant land in the area of Beechwood Place and Lynn Street. This is an important and environmentally sensitive area of our town. This land has been used for passive recreation and a center for environmental studies for many years.

We recently discovered that at least 52 beechwood trees have been cut down and used to partially build a fort or hut in the portion owned by the Borough. The average age of the trees cut down is 30 years old, with one almost 60 years old.

If you have any information related to who may have been involved with this damage, please share it with me. I would welcome the opportunity of explaining to those involved the impact of their actions on this part of town. We have not yet determined the financial cost of this action, but we are certain it will take years of mother nature to work her magic to restore the area.

To keep this from happening again, I ask your help and support in reporting any unusual activity at Beechwood Park. The police are keeping a close watch on the area. The Environmental Commission, Green Team and HP School officials are working to educate our citizens on the value of this natural treasure. I thank you in advance for your help.

NEW ROAD GRANT ANNOUNCED

The Borough of Harrington Park has been informed that our application for a NJDOT Local Aid an Economic Development Grant has been approved. We will be receiving \$146,500.00 for roadway preservation work on La Roche Avenue (Section 5) and Parkside Road (Section 3).

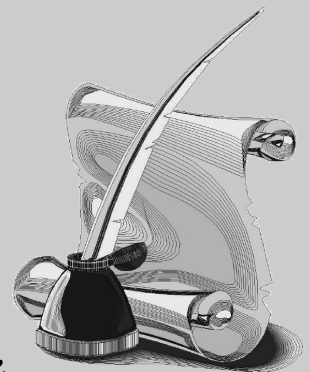
In addition, we are waiting for the opening of bids at the Riverside Cooperative for 2012 road improvement work in the Borough. I am hopeful that most of the areas under consideration can be addressed this year. I will keep you informed as to our progress regarding this matter.

JOINT INSURANCE AWARDS TO HP

On March 13, 2012, at the JIF Annual Safety Incentive Awards and Safety Kick Off meeting, Harrington Park was awarded \$3,000. We have reached the GOLD LEVEL and were recognized for Highest Achievement.

I want to thank Borough Clerk Ann Bistriz, Brian Eifert, Borough Risk Manager, Mark Kiernan, DPW Superintendent, Capt. Albert Maalouf, OIC Police Department for all the hard work that went into securing both awards.

As both the Mayor of Harrington Park, and a member of the 2012 JIF Executive Committee, I am well aware of the importance of our safety programs and procedures in protecting all of our Borough employees and assets. Congratulations and thank you.



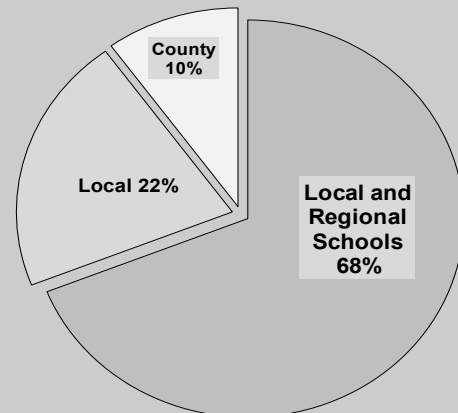

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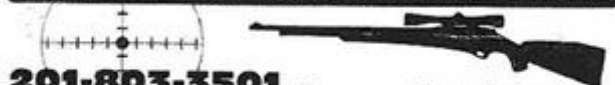
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
